

Middle School Student Volunteer Program

Objective:

To introduce middle school students to the concept of volunteerism, foster a sense of empathy and community engagement, and provide practical experience through a structured volunteer program.

Duration: 6 weeks (one lesson per week)

Week 1: Introduction to Volunteerism

Objective:

- Understand the concept of volunteerism and its importance in society.

Activities:

1. Icebreaker Activity: Have students share their experiences of helping others voluntarily.
2. Class Discussion: Define volunteerism and discuss its significance.
3. Brainstorming Session: Encourage students to brainstorm various volunteer opportunities in their community.
